SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY PROFILE

Our recent 40-million-dollar referendum renovated and expanded building and athletic facilities in order to facilitate an outstanding education for our student population. A suburban community of approximately 17,000 residents, the district is located in central New Jersey approximately 45 miles south of New York City and 60 miles north of Philadelphia. Holmdel is home to technology leaders such as Bell Works (site of the former Bell Labs) and Vonage. Holmdel Park provides extensive nature trails and athletic fields creating a rural feel. The area has been recognized as one of the top suburban communities in the region by The New York Times and NJ Monthly.

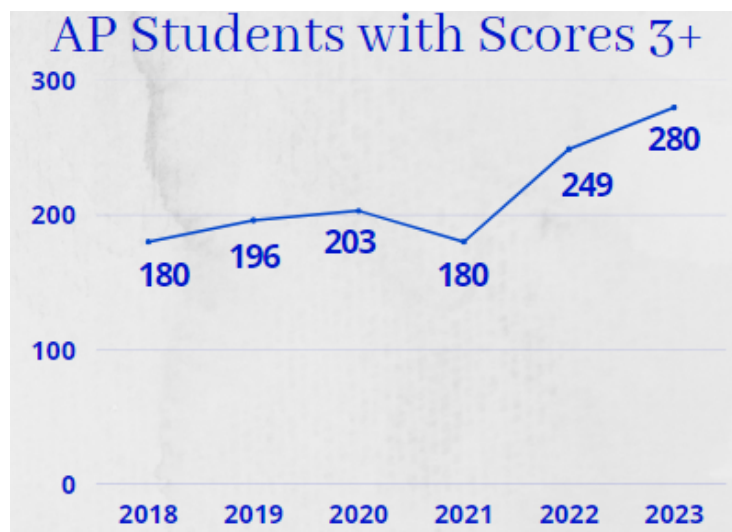
